## Note from the Executive Director

### Dear Cornerstone family and friends,

Te are excited to be off and running this year with 162 students at Cornerstone for in-person learning!

This September issue focuses on our commitment to developing servant leaders at Cornerstone. From our mission statement, "equipping them [students] with the knowledge, skills, and values necessary to become leaders who serve others in light of Christ and His Truth."



This year, we have increased investment in our seniors by providing opportunities for them to grow in their leadership skills and to put these principles into practice serving their fellow students.

Jonathan Powell, Dean of Students and Athletic Director, has led the effort to kickoff a new House system, empowering our Seniors to take the initiative in building Christian community at Cornerstone and in the High School.

All of the seniors interviewed for a House leadership position and were selected as a House Head or Assistant. Following a planning retreat, the seniors planned a House launch event, recommended House names, and created gift bags for their housemates. On Wednesday, September 22, Houses Douglass, McLeod, Truth, and Wells were announced and the high school students enjoyed lunch and a fun kickball competition at Nats Academy. A great start!

We also hired Rachel Baber, our new Post-Graduate Planning And Alumni Director and a former Capital Fellow, to develop a weekly Life Plan class for all high school students as well as engage students and parents in a cohesive planning process for college and post-graduate opportunities. Additionally, she will expand our connection to Cornerstone alumni to support our K-Life initiative.

We are deeply grateful for our many community partners, including Anacostia River Church, who have been present to connect with Cornerstone families, greet our students on the first day of school, and to recruit Partners to serve our students through the Partner Program. #### STAFF SPOTLIGHT: JONATHAN POWELL

#### Dean of Students and Athletic Director

The Cornerstone community has been immensely blessed by the leadership of Jonathan Powell (JP) over the last 15 years. Here is what Mr. Powell had to say when asked about his experience at Cornerstone and the impact his various roles here have had on his life and his faith.

## Q: What brought you to Cornerstone and what has made you stay?

A: Fifteen years ago, I started teaching PE at Cornerstone as a favor for a friend who knew that I loved sports, fitness, and kids. Originally I was hired as a long-term sub. I never planned on staying for a full year. However, during those first few months I fell in love with our precious students and the Cornerstone community. During my tenure at Cornerstone I've witnessed God's miraculous and transformative power in countless students and my life as well. I like to say that I grew up at Cornerstone. My relationship with God has grown tremendously. I've been forced to grapple with my own pre-judgements of others and beliefs that were rooted in my upbringing instead of God's truth. Some of the precious gifts I've received are opportunities to walk with young people





through life's devastating disasters and beautiful triumphs. I've wept with students as they experienced the untimely death of a parent or close relative, and celebrated students' spiritual and intellectual awakening.

## Q: What is your favorite part of your role at Cornerstone?

**A:** My favorite part of my job is discipling and engaging students. Over the years I've learned so much from my students and developed deep meaningful relationships with them. Our relationships have afforded me many opportunities to engage students outside of school and speak into their lives.

# Q: What are you most excited for this year as it pertains to Cornerstone's investment in developing servant leaders, particularly with our seniors?

**A:** I would describe our seniors as a group of deeply thoughtful, compassionate, hilarious and intelligent young artists, entrepreneurs, athletes and friends. As Cornerstone has elevated our seniors, I've seen them embrace more of their God given abilities and let their unique personalities shine. We've communicated that we don't expect perfection, but with additional privileges comes greater responsibility. It's been beautiful watching them mature and rise to the occasion.

eveloping servant leaders for life is an integral part of Cornerstone's mission and a marker by which we measure our success as an institution. This year, we are committed to growing our high schoolers in their leadership skills as well as college and career readiness.

Cornerstone now offers a Life Plan course led by Rachel Baber, our Director of Post-Graduate Planning and Alumni Relations, which is a class exclusively for high school students where they receive individualized resources and coaching to explore opportunities after high school. When asked what makes her most excited about Cornerstone's increased investment in student leadership and development, Ms. Baber said that

she is "most excited for the ways that students will expand their view of what they are capable of and for the students to see themselves as leaders and believe in their unique abilities."

One area in which seniors will have the chance to exercise leadership is through the House system. The House system is designed to foster community within the high school and to provide opportunities for student leadership and mentoring across grade levels.
